If sponsored by a Government scholarship, this should be stated on official headed paper with applicant's name, sponsor's name, contact details, duration of sponsorship, the amount of sponsorship or a statement that your sponsor will cover all your fees and living expenses. From 1 October 2009, for all points-based system Tier 4 applications, the amounts required to meet the maintenance criteria must be held in your personal or your parent(s)/ legal guardian(s) bank account for a minimum period of 28 days prior to making your visa application. The end of the 28 day period must not be more than 1 month before the date of your application and statements or bank letter must show the name of the account holder, the account number, the financial institution's name &amp; logo and the amount of money available.</b>

**Translation of Documents**

Any documents that have to be submitted in support of points claimed, which that are not in English or Welsh, must be accompanied by a full translation that can be independently verified by the UK Border Agency. The original translation must contain:

- a) confirmation from the translator that it is an accurate translation of the original document
- b) the date of the translation
- c) the translator's full name and signature and
- d) the translator's contact details
